KS2 SATs – Please remember children in Year 6 will be taking their SATs over four days from Monday 13th May to Thursday 16th May.

School Newsletter Survey – We had a tremendous response to our School Newsletter Survey. Thank you! We are pleased to report that of 140 responses 77.1% read the newsletter, 100% still want to receive a newsletter and 82.1% said they would like to receive the newsletter weekly. Items most wanted to be included were events that happened during the week (both curricular and extra-curricular), upcoming events, future dates, notices and reminders, sports events and photographs. Many responses were very positive regarding our newsletter, but we will aim to make it even better with your suggestions and ideas!

Active Travel – At SMSB we offer children the opportunity to take part in South Ribble Borough Council's Active Travel programme.

Last week, Dr Bike visited school offering a free bike repair session. They will be in school again on Friday 24th May to deliver Bike Fix training with Year 6. They will teach the children how to look after their bike and in particular how to repair a tyre if they were unfortunate enough to get a puncture! Children in reception took part in their Tots on Tyres first session last week, which aims to develop their coordination and balance, progressing from a balance bike, to riding a bike with pedals. Today, Year 6 have had the opportunity to participate in a Bikeability course which teaches the children the skills and confidence needed to ride a bike safely in particularly when they are on the roads. Scoot Safe is a fun safety training course for scooter riders. Children in Years 3 and 4 will be taking part in this activity on Friday 10th May.

Thank you to the Active Health Team for their excellent delivery of this programme.

Don't Miss Out on Funded Childcare - Did you know that from the term after your child's third birthday, they can have up to 15 hours a week early education funding from the government? You may be able to get up to 30 hours a week if you meet the eligibility criteria. Attending the fun sessions at a nursery, play group or childminder, can help your child:

- Make new friends and build their confidence
- Improve their speaking and listening skills
- Learn and develop through play
- Get ready for starting school

Some two-year-olds in Lancashire may also qualify for a funded place of up to 15 hours a week depending on your household income or if you are in receipt of certain benefits. - Barlow class have been practising pencil control this week, understanding the World and learning fun facts about Dinosaurs. They have also been following instructions by drawing a Tiger.
