

Reducing Illness Days – When your child is ill it can sometimes be difficult to make the choice of whether or not to send them to school. NHS guidelines tell us that it is fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or common cold. But if they have a high temperature, keep them off school until it goes. This week, unfortunately, our attendance has dipped mainly due to a virus, which has been wiping out clusters of children! Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly. If your child is saying they do not feel well and you are unsure about whether it warrants a day off please send them to school. If they are truly ill we will ring you. Use common sense when deciding whether or not your child is too ill to attend school. Ask yourself the following questions:

- Is my child well enough to do the activities of the school day?
- Does my child have a condition that could be passed on to other children or school staff?
- Would I take a day off work if I had this condition?







**May the Month of Mary** - The Catholic Church throughout the world dedicate the month of May to Mary, the Mother of Jesus. She is also the patron Saint of our school and church. Throughout May we ask that you join us in praying the Rosary each day.

During this day we ask that children come to school dressed in any colour they choose for a voluntary contribution of £1 (please pay via parent pay). Throughout the day the children will be taking part in a range of different 'Elmer' themed activities and is a chance to celebrate the importance of friendship, kindness and inclusivity, themes that run through all 30 of the 'Elmer' picture books created by David McKee.

**Egyptian Workshop** – Children in Years 4 and 5 had a visit from 'Delve into History' this week where they took part in a workshop learning about Ancient Egypt through the use of artefacts. They learnt about the importance of mummification, the Ancient Egyptian hierarchy system and the jobs that people did within this, the clothes that people wore and how clothes showed status. They had an amazing time!
