Punctuality! – At St Mary's & St Benedict's we believe the poor punctuality or leaving before the end of the school day is not acceptable, only in exceptional and unavoidable circumstances, and we would like to thank parents and carers who support this. Our school day starts when we open the doors at 8:45am to allow the children to settle into class and catch up with their friends before learning begins. We appreciate sometimes it's difficult to get your child to school on time, for many different reasons, but please reach out to us if you are struggling, we want the best for your child and are always here to help. Children often feel embarrassed walking into class late and can reluctant to then attend school at all. Lessons are also disrupted when children arrive late or leave early. Please remember school finishes at 3:15pm.

Missing just 10 minutes of school a day is the same as missing 2 weeks over the year! School data shows a link between poor attendance and under-achievement. In the first 3 weeks of the summer term over 55 hours of learning has been lost! Please let's try and improve this.

Well done to Marsden class for having the highest attendance this week!

Year 6 SATs – Next week, our Year 6 children will be taking their SATs. If this is your child, please encourage them to eat well and get plenty of rest and relaxation over the weekend, and most importantly, remind them to stay calm, not to worry and do their best. They have all been working very hard and we are very proud of them!

Please ensure that your child is here punctually, so that they are ready to sit their tests in a calm manner and can give their best effort. The children are invited to arrive at school early so that they can have breakfast together. PTA Non-Uniform Day - This will be on Friday 17th May. Children can wear their choice of clothes in return for a £1 donation, to be paid on ParentPay. Please support our PTA. They are doing a tremendous job in raising money to provide children with things the school budget does not allow.

Family Support – Our Family Support Worker, Julia Johnson, is in school every day to support children and families. She delivers Relax Kids sessions to the children and next week Year 6 will have their turn. The aim of the Relax Kids system is to create calm and confident children. It teaches the children mindfulness and relaxation techniques to support their mental and emotional health. The range of tools and techniques help to calm their body and mind and build confidence and self-esteem to help make children feel happier and healthier.

Pentecost Sunday – Pentecost Sunday is celebrated 50 days after Easter and this year it falls on Sunday 19th May. Beesley class have been learning about Pentecost and how the event celebrates the coming of the gift of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. The children made streamers to 'Share the Good News of Jesus with everyone' The children used streamers to create a dance.

If your child would like to join in the fun and they don't currently have school meals, please order and pay for the meal on ParentPay. If your child is in Beesley, Benedict, Finch or Haydock class there will be no charge and there is also no charge for children in the junior classes who are entitled to free school meals.

Elmer Day - As part of their topic 'All Creatures Great and Small', children in Barlow and Beesley classes are looking at the stories of Elmer. As the official Elmer Day is on Saturday 25th May they are having their own Elmer Day on Friday 24th May. On this day we ask that children come to school dressed in any colour they choose for a voluntary contribution of £1 (please pay via ParentPay). Throughout the day the children will be taking part in 'Elmer' themed activities celebrating the importance of friendship, kindness and inclusivity.
