Species	A grouping or kinds of animals with similar characteristics.
Subgroup	A group within a larger group.
Classification Key	A series of questions that help to identify a species.
Region	A large space or area.
Blubber	A layer of fat beneath the skin of sea mammals.
Ecosystem	A community of living things.
Oxygenised	Contains oxygen.
