What should I already know?

- The past is defined as a time gone by. The present relates to current happenings.
- There are some things that have stayed the same over time, but some things have changed. I am able to talk about some reasons why these changes have happened.

Key Vocabulary

Sea side	A place by the beach, such as a holiday resort.
Tourism	the commercial organisation and operation of holidays and visits to places of interest.
Leisure	The use of free time for enjoyment.
Resort	a place that is frequented for holidays or recreation or for a particular purpose.

Key Learning Objectives
