Southworth Class Visit the Tale of Pandora - In English this week, Southworth class myths' topic brought them to the tale of Pandora. Beauty and the Beast - Children in Year 5 will be visiting Brownedge St Mary's Catholic High School to watch their production of Beauty and the Beast on Tuesday 9th July. It is sure to be a fantastic performance!

After School Clubs – Chris and Marcus' after school clubs for this half term are available to book on School Spider. All year groups will be doing Multi-skills. There is no limit to numbers but we do need parents or carers consent before children can attend.

Drinks in School - In the interest of good dental care, we follow Lancashire County Council's guidance in not allowing fruit juices, including fruit cordials or flavoured water to be drunk throughout the day in school. Each class has their own arrangements for water bottles to ensure children stay hydrated. Please ensure children have a water bottle filled with fresh water each day to support us with this.

Sports drinks are not appropriate for children as the high electrolyte content can cause imbalances in your child's system, which can be dangerous. If a child brings a sports drink into school it will be confiscated until the end of the day, and will only be given back to a responsible adult.

Uniform - Please make sure your child's uniform is clearly labelled. This particulary applies to jumpers and cardigans, as these items of uniform are frequently taken off and left around school. We are now taking uniform orders for those wanting new uniform to be collected before the end of term. Please order by Friday 28th June. Please also remember not to buy large bags or rucksacks for September as only Book Bags will be allowed in school.

Family Support – There are times when everyone feels they could do with a little support for many different reasons. We are fortunate to have an experienced Family Support Worker, Julia Johnson, who is in school every day to support children and families, where a need arises.
