Parents and carers are invited but please remember we do not allow photographs or video recordings to be made on school grounds. This is to protect and safeguard our children. Please make sure children in Beesley, Benedict, Finch and Haydock classes have their PE kit in school so they can take part in the practices. **Sunny Weather** – Please remember to put sun cream on your child before they come to school. They may bring sun cream into school, but it must be labelled and kept in their tray. Children will be encouraged to put it on by themselves but we will obviously assist the younger ones. Also, make sure they have a hat or cap and they bring a bottle of water to keep hydrated during the day.

Family Support – There are times when everyone feels they could do with a little support for many different reasons. We are fortunate to have an experienced Family Support Worker, Julia Johnson, who is in school every day to support children and families, where a need arises. Playground Safety – If your child is in KS2, please remind them that balls aren't allowed on the playground either before or after school. Also, the playground equipment on both the KS1 and KS2 playgrounds must not be used by the children before or after school as school staff cannot supervise during these times.

School Uniform - Please remember when you are purchasing school uniform for the new school year, that skirts/pinafores and trousers/shorts must be navy blue; white polo shirts are worn under a red cardigan/sweatshirt; sensible black school shoes; navy/black socks for boys and white socks for girls. Please also remember we don't allow large bags or rucksacks to be brought to school as space to store them is restricted. Your child should be bringing what they need in a book bag.

PE Kit – We ask that children in Reception and KS1 bring their PE kit into school in a drawstring bag and it is left here only to be brought home at the end of each half-term to be washed. The kit should consist of navy blue PE shorts, a plain white t-shirt and black PE pumps. In KS2, children should come to school dressed in their PE kit on their PE days. They must only wear plain, unbranded, unisex navy blue joggers; a plain, unbranded white t-shirt and sensible trainers suitable for PE. They can wear their school sweatshirt or cardigan. Please remember leggings/cycling shorts are not suitable PE kit and we won't allow them to be worn.

KS1 Visit Blackpool – The children had a great day visiting Blackpool on Monday. At the Sea Life Centre, they encountered some of the world's most incredible animals, including huge sharks, mysterious stingrays, seahorses, thousands of tropical fish and much, much more. After lunch they had a walk along the promenade seeing the amazing sights and finished with a delicious ice cream in the sunshine!







Dinner Money Debt – Please make sure any dinner money debt is paid before we break up for summer. This particularly applies if your child is in Year 6. Thank you.

FAO Year 2 Parents and Carers – When your child returns to school in September in Year 3, if you wish them to have a school dinner you must pay on ParentPay, unless we have been notified that you are on benefits related free school meals (if you are unsure, please contact the school office).
