DfE Attendance Law - The law entitles every child of compulsory school age to an efficient, full-time education suitable to their age, aptitude, and any special educational need they may have. It is the legal responsibility of every parent to make sure their child receives that education either by attendance at a school or by education otherwise than at a school. Where parents decide to have their child registered at school, they have an additional legal duty to ensure their child attends that school regularly. This means their child must attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school. This is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances.

We Love Reading – At St Mary's & St Benedict's we actively encourage reading at home. Please can you listen to your child read and sign their Reading Record every day. Children also read in school and are awarded a bronze certificate for 50 reads and silver certificate for 100 reads. When they reach 150 reads, they are awarded with a gold certificate and can choose a book of their choice from a selection we have in school.
