What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	69.6%	Children were taken swimming during Y4 and then an additional term of weekly swimming was undertaken, during Y5, to improve the percentage of children that can swim 25m.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke]?	63.0%	Most of the cohort can swim at least two strokes to a competent standard for at least 25m.

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort are able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	91.3%	Only 4 pupils did not pass the check.
